Detachment

"Without detachment, I was imprisoned while my boyfriend was in jail"

I came to AI-Anon when my boyfriend was sent to jail. For the first time in my life I could not maintain the illusion of control.

It was devastating to me. I crawled on my knees into the rooms of Al-Anon. Looking back, I'm grateful that I came in that way. I grabbed the Al-Anon program and clung to it like a life raft. Doing so saved my life. came to Al-Anon when my boyfriend was sent to jail. For the first time in my life I could not maintain the illusion of control.

When my boyfriend (whom I eventually married) was in jail, I put my life on hold as if I were in jail, too. I spent hours, months, and years waiting: waiting to get in to see him, waiting for him to call, waiting for him to get out so that my life could begin again, waiting for him to get sober so that we could make plans I could count on— waiting for the life I expected to finally appear.

Finally, I had an epiphany. I am addicted to problems—especially his. I always thought I was addicted to alcoholics, but it turns out that I am drawn to alcoholics because they are a reliable source of problems—problems with jobs, money, people, the law, or their health.

I don't believe that being attracted to problems is a bad thing in itself. I enjoy puzzles, mysteries, and conundrums. If there is a dilemma to be resolved, I'm happy to be a sounding board. But like any character trait, taking that attraction to the extreme quickly reveals its dark side. Put a problem in front of me and I might as well be an alcoholic in a dark bar with a fresh shot glowing up at him. I have a really hard time not picking it up and letting the problem consume me.

That insight gave me a new awareness of how the First Step could work in my life. I am powerless over other people's problems. As soon as I pick them up, my life is unmanageable. Based on that new understanding, I had a vision about how my addiction to problems actually works in my life.

In my vision, I see my husband standing in the center of a pair of train tracks. In the distance, a train is approaching. As the train gets closer, I become more agitated. I start with quiet warnings, "Look, honey, a train." That soon gives way to loud and increasingly insistent repetition until I am hysterically screaming at him, "A train, a train!" But he remains unconcerned, looking away, smiling as if at some private joke. Finally, the train is upon him. I can't stand it anymore, and in desperation, I throw myself in front of the train. I get flattened, and he saunters away untouched—again.

"This time, I let the train rush on by. As it passed me, I felt the wind on my face, felt it blow back my hair, and knew that I was where I was supposed to be—on the platform with my Higher Power, giving my loved one the dignity of dealing with his own train."

For years, I threw myself in front of that train, because I couldn't stand not to do it. I didn't know that I didn't have to do that. Finally, with Al-Anon's help, it became clear to me that I needed to step back and let the train hit him. After all, it is his train; I have trains of my own to deal with.

Last year, as a result of his disease, my husband had a major meltdown, broke the law, and ended up back in jail. This time, it was different. This time, I let the train rush on by. As it passed me, I felt the wind on my face, felt it blow back my hair, and knew that I was where I was supposed to be—on the platform with my Higher Power, giving my loved one the dignity of dealing with his own train.

It was very painful to watch that train take him down. But this time, I did not go to jail with my husband. I focused on my own life and found my own joy while he was exploring what I hope was his bottom. When I was tempted to intervene, to try and make things easier for him, or to try and experience his imprisonment for him or with him, I reminded myself that his choices brought him to jail—not mine.

Today, my husband has 15 months of sobriety in A.A. Was it because I finally found the strength and understanding to keep off his tracks? Who knows? What I do know is that without that crisis, and the opportunity it gave me to practice responding in a new way, I would not have learned this important lesson in detaching with love—enough love for myself, to keep me from jumping in front of other people's trains."

Loving Detachment

I have learned that loving detachment includes having several outlets. For me it includes having many support systems in place. I've recently discovered how freeing and rewarding it is to share my feelings, frustrations and challenges with others. For years I was too embarrassed and ashamed of the situation to confide in anyone. Recently I realized (and took to heart) THE TRUTH WILL SET YOU FREE. I have discovered that I can detach from the situation by not engaging in irrational thinking or irrational arguing. I can detach from the situation by reaching to my higher power and finding confidence in me and my talents. I can and will focus my energies in positive thoughts and actions like journaling and reading.

For years I let the situation lead me instead of moving away from the situation. I recently realized that I may live with an alcoholic but I can choose to live in peace and accept that my job is not to fix the alcoholic rather it is to improve myself by gaining knowledge and wisdom. The Hope in Alateen

No matter how difficult our situation, we can build a better life for ourselves by remembering to reach out for recovery. Just keep these points in mind:

- Alateen has helped many others. None of us is alone—many other teenagers have gone through the same problems that we have.
- Alcoholism affects the person who drinks and those who are close to the problem drinker.
- Learning the facts about alcoholism can make it easier to accept it as a disease.
- Another person's addiction to alcohol is no reflection on us. Remember that we didn't cause it and cannot control or cure it.
- We are not responsible for the alcoholic's behavior.
- It helps to talk things over with someone we trust.
- Being patient with ourselves and our families is important. Alcoholism has affected us and our families for a long time, and it may take a long time to recover.
- Try to improve, "One Day at a Time."
- Attend Alateen, Al-Anon, and open A.A. meetings.
- Study the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions. They are an important part of the Alateen program.





Try an Alateen Electronic Meeting in the Al-Anon Family Groups Mobile App

Alateen meetings in the Mobile App are for young people aged 13 to 18 who have been affected by someone else's drinking. We are invited to share experience, strength, and hope with other teens.

Alateen meetings in the Mobile App are moderated. The meetings are available only to Alateens and take place when the assigned adult Alateen Group Sponsors are present. At this time, Electronic Alateen meetings can only be accessed in the Al-Anon Family Groups Mobile App.

Alateen Safety

The Alateen meetings in the Mobile App are administered by Al-Anon Family Group Headquarters, Inc., and hosted by Areas (states/provinces) in our U.S./Canada structure or recognized international General Service Offices. These meetings are the only online Alateen meetings eligible to use the Alateen name. The Alateen meetings in the Mobile App are available in English only at this time.

Teens aged 13 to 18 can download the AFG Mobile App to attend Alateen meetings.

Once in the meeting room, the teen can change the screen name to the name they want used in order to be recognized by other Alateens and the Sponsors.

Once the Mobile App is downloaded, teens can access all features in the Mobile App as well as all Alateen and Al-Anon meetings. The Mobile App can be downloaded in English, Spanish or French but the Alateen meetings are only available in English at this time.

At least two Alateen Group Sponsors are present for each meeting.

ALATEEN is a fellowship of young Al-Anon members, usually teenagers, whose lives have been affected by someone else's drinking.

PURPOSES OF ALATEEN

Young People Come Together To:

- Share experience, strength and hope with each other.
- Discuss their difficulties.
- Learn effective ways to cope with their problems.
- Encourage one another.
- Help each other understand the principles of the Al-Anon program.
- Learn how to use the <u>Twelve Steps</u> and <u>Alateen's Twelve Traditions</u>.

ALATEEN MEMBERS LEARN:

- Alcoholism is a disease.
- They can detach themselves emotionally from the drinker's problems while continuing to love the person.
- They are not the cause of anyone else's drinking or behavior.
- They cannot change or control anyone but themselves.
- They have spiritual and intellectual resources with which to develop their own potentials, no matter what happens at home.
- They can build satisfying and rewarding life experiences for themselves.

What is Alateen?

Alateen is a part of Al-Anon, it is a program of recovery for young people whose lives have been affected by someone else's drinking. Younger family members have suffered as we have and are desperately in need of a Twelve Step recovery in Alateen.

Alateen cannot Exist without Alateen Sponsors. Each Alateen group needs Sponsors, active adult members of Al-anon being of service. Are you looking for service work that's rewarding, loving and exciting? You must be 21 years of age and an active member of Al-Anon for 2 years and receive AMIAS (Al-Anon Member in Service to Alateen) training.

Ventura County AIS Board has found a dedicated and qualified Alateen Coordinator to serve on the Board. Please give a hearty welcome to Anton C. who joined the Board in service on April 17th. The Alateens of Ventura County welcome you Anton and thank you for your service.

Step Nine

"Step 9 was one of the most difficult things I have ever done. Even though the previous steps prepared me for making amends, I knew some people would not be receptive and that scared me. Thank God I had my sponsor to talk me through it. She helped me understand that I did not need to run out and make amends to everyone at the same time and that I could choose which people to start with based on my comfort level. So I started out with people in my life who had passed away. I wrote them letters and since they could not respond positively or negatively, it was easier to really take my time and say everything I needed to say without fear. With others, my higher power created unexpected opportunities for me to make my amends and I felt the guidance I needed. And with those who I was unable to find the words I needed. I chose to change my behavior towards them as my amends. I think those might've been the most effective amends in seeing results. The difference step 9 made in my life is enormous. I no longer carry the extremely heavy burden of guilt. I feel free. know I can now move forward. Step 9 might be scary but the results are well worth it." 



Submit a written financial report at each general AIS and Service Board meeting with copies for ISR's. Prepare an annual budget to be presented at the September Service Board meeting and the October general AIS Meeting. Cooperate with other AIS officers, i.e., CPC, Alateen, Institutions, and PI, encouraging them to utilize archive materials. Be aware of all commitments and obligations of position and follow through appropriately.

LITERATURE DISTRIBUTION CENTER (LDC) Chair coordinates and leads a volunteer staff to provide Al-Anon members with local access and quick delivery of Al-Anon books, pamphlets, booklets, kits, posters, films, guidelines and other Al-Anon material. The LDC and WSO work in partnership to carry the message of hope and recovery through our Conference Approved Literature and service tools. An LDC's surplus earnings are used to support other local Al-Anon services. We need volunteers for the LDC and workers to staff the facility. Without you our LDC will close permanently. 

Letter From Your Editor on Detachment (with Love)

Hello Readers,

Since the accidental death of my son 74 days ago, I have been drownproofing in an abysmal pool of guilt, grief, sadness, martyrdom, self-pity, remorse and insane activity. Every time my face pops up out of the pool for air, I see my Higher Power floating above the water. I feel his unconditional love and forgiveness reaching for me. T hear the phone ring, my text message alert beeps, my email chimes, the doorbell peals with the love and support of my Army of Alanon supporters, my sponsor, friends and neighbors and I feel the outpouring of love. I struggle to swim to shore. Inch by inch I reach toward the edge of the pool. In each inch is a moment of my path to recovery. My HP is holding me in His arms as he held my son in his arms to the end. (I used the reference to drownproofing, as it was part of the Red Cross Water safety test that I failed at least 10 times the summer before 11th grade. I am al Al-Anon drownproofer now.


The stages of grief do not come in order. Shock/denial, pain/guilt, anger/bargaining, depression/loneliness/reflection, upward turn, reconstruction, acceptance and finally hope. Grief was a swirling tornado as these stages bombarded me, sometimes singly, sometimes all at once. However, acceptance and hope are slowly winning the fight with the help of my Higher Power, my program, my Al-Anon Army, Sponsor, neighbors and friends. My son was loved by many who saw the sweet and helpful nature of his inner being.

In Al-Anon, I have learned that tears are a healing way of detaching from a lot of my grief. Every time grief comes up I focus on the Serenity Prayer, cry and release. I can't say that I have been working a perfect Al-Anon program (you know perfectionism is one of my "strengths"), however it is one minute of time as I detach from the grief and seek to honor, love and protect the beautiful 39 years that I shared with my son, Mathew James. Mathew means a gift from God, which he personified on a daily basis to me so many people.

As I detach from my grief, I am bolstered by my son's legacy to me....Four geriatric, but loving, animals who also seek to understand our loss and adapt. The three dogs, Sharkey (age 14) died six weeks following my son's death of heart failure, which leaves Coco Bear (age 13), Foxy Girl (age 18) and of course the cat Bella Kitty age 18. These beautiful fur babies joined our family of one loving 9 year old English Bulldog,Spike, who loves his cousins (but they only barely tolerate him).

Feeding, kitty litter, mini walks, and vacuuming pet hair keep me hopping. We are all detaching with LOVE and beautiful, sweet memories. I could go on to remind myself that I also need to detach (with love) from my qualifier's alcoholic behavior, but that would take an entire Scoop and it can get messy. Working on that one minute at a time. Below is my new blended Family.

Traditional Popcorn Ball TOTAL TIME: Prep/Total Time: 20 min.YIELD: 20 servings. Kids of all ages enjoy this popcorn ball recipe as an old-fashioned holiday treat. One batch goes a long way. —Cathy Karges, Hazen, North Dakota. Kids love to make them and you can make them in

every color of the rainbow.

Ingredients

7 quarts of Popcorn (no butter or salt) Air-popped or stove top works best.

- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup light corn syrup
- 1/4 cup water
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 3 tablespoons butter
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- Food coloring, optional

Directions

1. Place popcorn in a large baking pan; keep warm in a 200° oven.

2. In a heavy saucepan, combine the sugar, corn syrup, water and salt. Cook over medium heat until a candy thermometer reads 235° (soft-ball stage).


3. Remove from the heat. Add the butter, vanilla and food coloring if desired; stir until butter is melted. Immediately pour over popcorn and stir until evenly coated.

4. When mixture is cool enough to handle, quickly shape into 3-in. balls, dipping hands in cold water to prevent sticking.

Note from Editor....This was and is one of my favorite fall recipes. When I was growing up, Popcorn Balls were a Fall, Halloween & Christmas must have, cheap and delicious. This must be the lowcalorie version, because we always coated our hands in butter not water to make the popcorn Balls.

Add 4 cups of strawberry ice cream into a blender.



CROCHET CORNER

Crocheting and Knitting are Greek to me.....I could be designing a ant farm....lol. But for those of you who love to Crochet, this pattern looked good and easy for the fall. Make them as baby gifts, donate them to shelters, design a crib mobile...I can think of a few Cats and dogs who would love to treasure.



WHAT IS AMIGURUMI?

Here is the link for AMIGURUMI Bunny who is almost as precious as the Lamb. I is here because it is free.

You might've noticed the adorable crochet plush amigurumi from our <u>crochet stuffed animals collection</u>, they are made with the same tools as normal crochet. Only, you will primarily be working in spiral rounds with single crochet stitches in a tighter tension, making 3D-shaped parts, and stuffing these parts with polyester filling.

"Ami" means knitted or crocheted, and "amigurumi" means a stuffed toy. Put together, "Amigurumi" refers to knitted or crochet toys in the form of objects, people, cartoon characters, food, and many more. It is one of the most popular types of crochet, and with the proper techniques, you can create anything with this craft.

Since the word "Amigurumi" means "Crochet Stuffed Animals" or "Crochet Animals", we will be using these terms interchangeably throughout this article.

CROCHET SUPPLIES FOR AMIGURUMI

YARN CHOICE

When picking yarn for your first easy pattern, it's best to follow the yarn type the pattern calls for. This will ensure that your amigurumi animal looks somewhat like the original pattern. We could go on and on about the variety of yarns in the market; yarns made from a particular material, yarns of a specific weight... However, only some are suitable for an Amigurumi project. Below are three types of yarn commonly used to crochet animals:

Acrylic yarns are more flexible compared to other yarns and are often used to create soft crochet projects like the Amigurumi doll. It's great for complete beginners as it's very affordable and comes in many colors.

100% cotton yarns are tightly spun, less fuzzy, and create clearer stitches. They make durable Amigurumi pieces and are an excellent yarn option if you're making crochet baby toys.

Semi-cotton blend yarns consist of 50% acrylic yarn and 50% cotton yarn. It's usually lightweight, which makes it suitable for medium-sized crochet animals. Projects made with semi-cotton blend yarns are soft yet durable and are machine-washable! Be sure to choose non-pilling grade yarn for the best quality.

YARN WEIGHT

Depending on the Amigurumi pattern, you may use light yarn weight or bulkier yarn weight. However, the best yarn weight for crochet beginners is light worsted (DK / 8 ply) to worsted yarn weight. These medium-weight yarns allow you to see the stitches clearly, and keep your stitches tight while ensuring the stuffing doesn't poke out between the loose stitches. It's a great yarn weight for beginners to practice their skills.

CROCHET HOOK

The ideal hook size for Amigurumi is 2.5mm to 3.5mm, but there's no definite answer to this. The best tip for beginners is to use a hook size and yarn weight recommended in the amigurumi patterns. Otherwise, you may downsize at least one to two sizes from the recommended hook size stated on the yarn label.

OTHER MATERIALS & TOOLS

• Stuffing & Weight

Stuffing not only puffs up the crochet animals but also gives them a "backbone" and supports it to sit or stand. You may use wool, cotton, stashed yarn, and stuffing from an old cushion; however, the best stuffing for Amigurumi is *polyester fiberfill*. They're made from a blend of synthetic fibers that are loosely fluffed to create a light texture. This stuffing allows you to machine wash your crochet animals without ruining the shape after each wash. High-grade Polyester fiberfill is hypoallergenic, making it safe for babies and pregnant ladies. If needed, you may also add some stuffing pallets to give your crochet Amigurumi some weight.

Safety Eyes

Bring your Amigurumis to life by adding facial features like eyes, nose, and lips! Safety eyes come in various sizes, shapes, and colors in specific sizes or sets with different sizes. They also include washers to help secure the eyes or noses in place.

A good pattern will tell you which round to insert your eye and how many stitches apart you need to keep between the eyes. This step is usually done before filling your crochet animals' heads with stuffing.

Embroidery Floss

While safety eyes are relatively safe for kids once it's locked in place, they may still become a dangerous choking hazard if not fastened securely. So, if you have doubts, use embroidery floss. They're highly recommended if you're gifting the crochet animals to small children and kids below the age of four.

Stitch Markers

Another helpful tool is stitch markers. These tiny plastic pins are inserted into the first stitch of a new row/round to identify an important place in your pattern. Stitch markers are optional but come in handy for Amigurumi projects as it helps you track where to increase or decrease your stitches.

You may also opt to use a string of yarn in a different color to mark the first stitch of a new round. At the end of the crochet, just pull to remove the string.

Felt & Fabric

Felt or fabric is sometimes used to replace safety eyes or embroidery floss for the crochet animals' facial features. Since you can cut them into any shape you desire or stack them with different colors, they add personality to your crochet Amigurumi, making them look more realistic. They're suitable for animal-themed Amigurumis or cartoon-character dolls. Like embroidery floss, felt or fabric is a safer choice for toddlers.

• Needles and Scissors

Additionally, you'll need to prepare a tapestry or darning needle to sew/weave in the yarn to complete your Amigurumi project. Lastly, you will need a pair of scissors to cut the yarn.

BASIC CROCHET STITCHES AND CROCHET TERMS FOR AMIGURUMI

To get started on how to crochet amigurumi, you'll need to learn a few basic crochet stitches. It's best to practice until you are familiar with the stitches before picking a pattern so that you wouldn't need to refer to the book or video every time you forget how to continue a stitch.

Even though the stitches vary from project to project, some stitches are often used in Amigurumi patterns; <u>magic ring</u> or magic circle, <u>slip knot</u>, <u>chain</u>, <u>slip stitch</u>, <u>single crochet</u>, <u>increase</u>, and <u>invisible decrease</u>. Other stitches that you may see in the written instructions include half double crochet, double crochet, treble crochet, invisible decrease three stitches, front loops only, back loops only.
